Onion Lake Cree Nation & Lloydminster Area

EARLY CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION PROGRAM (ECIP)

ECIP is provided to families of children from birth to 6 years of age who are experiencing, or at risk for, developmental delays and who have, or are eligible for, Treaty Status.

FAMILY SUPPORT

Family support is available to families of children and youth from 6 to 18 years of age experiencing developmental concerns and who have, or are eligible for, Treaty Status.

HOW WE WORK WITH FAMILIES

Parents or caregivers are active team members with their Program Facilitator and others. Our approach is strength-based and family-centred. Goals are set based on what matters most to each family. Staff meet with families in their homes or other community spaces such as a school or Health Centre.

REFERRALS

Referrals are accepted from families themselves or from professionals. All referrals require the consent of the family.

CHILD & YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Screening tools help us to identify strengths and developmental needs. We share information and ideas for ways to support and encourage development.

PARENTING

We help families with parent-child relationships & positive parenting. Programs include: Kids Have Stress Too, Nobody's Perfect, and Keep Connected. Group sessions can be provided to connect families with one another.

SERVICE COORDINATION

We coordinate services and assist with applications under Jordan's Principle or other provincial and federal funding for respite, equipment, specialized services, etc. We help as children and youth transition between programs. Appointment accompaniment to support effective connection to other services is available.

INFORMATION & REFERRAL

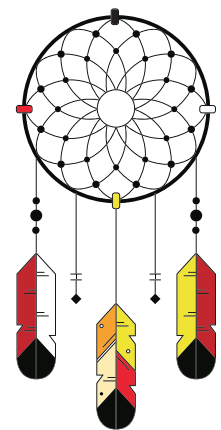
We connect parents and caregivers with programs information, tools and resources. If you have questions we can help find answers!
